

Management Development Programme on Global Issues

The Management Development Programme (MDP) on Global Issues brought home to the participants the evolving nature of international collaboration and cooperation in every aspect of the governance apparatus of a country or a state. The significance of the MDP was further accentuated as it was held during the pandemic that witnessed global efforts in coordination across multiple economic sectors.

The MDP's objective was to provide awareness and detailed insights on the impact and inter-connectedness that Global Issues have on the areas of responsibility being handled by senior officers of the Government of Haryana who have already been in service for at least 15 to 20 years.

With the officers drawn from key sectors including health, education and infrastructure, the MDP focused on

the embedded nature of global issues in all sectors of Haryana's development.

Against the backdrop of the fast-paced changes in global issues due to the pandemic, the MDP brought home to the officers the importance of timely and fast paced adaption and coordination going beyond the state and the Union, conecting with friendly foreign governments and multilateral institutions including the United Nations.

The programme adapted to the conditions set by the pandemic with the first two sessions, in October and December 2020, being held digitally through Google Meet. The third session, in February 2021, was a hybrid one with the speakers coming to HIPA and the participants connecting with them digitally. The fourth session, held in July 2021, reverted to the classic classroom

method of training with both speakers and officers being physically present at HIPA for the lectures and the interactive sessions.

HIPA opened up the MDP to other important stakeholders contributing to development of Haryana, including the well-known Ashoka University and India's iconic agricultural research institutions of the Indian Council of Agricultural Research, located in Haryana, such as the Indian Institute of Wheat and Barley Research.

These included eminent former and serving Ambassadors of India and friendly foreign countries, Secretaries to the Government of India, iconic former and serving heads of defence services, prominent NGOs, corporate leaders, renowned activists, journalists, academics and personalities from the fields of sports and culture.

Delivery Mode

The participants were provided reading material from books, journals, internet articles and blogs on each lecture and the biodata of the distinguished speakers. The purpose was to stimulate interest amongst the participants and enable them to prepare better to interact with the distinguished speakers with their views and questions.

Each lecture was for one hour followed by an interactive session that often went beyond one hour, reflecting the interest generated by the lecture. In most lectures, power point presentations were given. A summing-up of the lectures of a session was given at the end of each of the four sessions.

All sessions were held under Chatham House Rules to foster active learning and facilitate open and transparent communication between the participants and the distinguished speakers.

Assessment and feedback

The participants were assessed through multiple methods including a write-up or presentation on a chosen topic. The quality of answers by them in a given session reflected their understanding and interest towards the MDP. A quiz was conducted in the concluding session

The feedback from participants showed their appreciation of the relevance of the MDP reflecting their understanding of post-COVID multipolarity, global financial order and cyber-crimes and other subjects. The participants confirmed that the MDP has been instrumental in refining their decision-making processes.
